WHAT: Pack 102 'Leave No Trace' Service Project & Family Campout

WHEN: June 4-6th, 2010

WHERE: Hill Country State Natural Area, Bandera, Texas

WHO: All Pack 102 Scouts and immediate family are invited

COST: \$5 per person to attend to cover the cost of meals (siblings age 3 and under are free)

** All Cubs must have a responsible adult attend with them for the service project & campout.

Please bring a sack dinner for Friday night and the pack will provide Saturday meals and Sunday breakfast. Please provide your own beverages, extra water for drinking and washing your dishes, washable plates and cups for each meal. There is no running water at the campsite, so please bring extra for all your needs, including hygiene needs.

*** NO PETS ALLOWED!!**

*** NO LIQUID OR FUEL STOVES ALLOWED.**

Cub Scout Leave No Trace Patch Requirements For Scouts:

1. Discuss with your leader or parent/guardian the importance of the Leave No Trace front country guidelines.
2. On three separate outings, practice the front country guidelines of Leave No Trace.
3. Boys in a Tiger Cub den complete the activities for Achievement 5, Let's Go Outdoors; boys in a Wolf den complete Requirement 7, Your Living World; boys in a Bear den complete Requirement 12, Family Outdoor Adventures; boys in a Webelos den earn the Outdoorsman activity badge.
4. Participate in a Leave No Trace-related service project.
5. Promise to practice the Leave No Trace front country guidelines by signing the Cub Scout Leave No Trace Pledge.
6. Draw a poster to illustrate the Leave No Trace frontcountry guidelines and display it at a pack meeting.

Cub Scout Leave No Trace Patch Requirements For Leaders:

1. Discuss with your den's Cub Scouts or your pack's leaders the importance of the Leave No Trace front country guidelines.
 2. On three separate outings demonstrate and practice the front country guidelines of Leave No Trace.
 3. Participate in presenting a den, pack, district, or council awareness session on Leave No Trace front country guidelines.
 4. Participate in a Leave No Trace-related service project.
 5. Commit yourself to the Leave No Trace front country guidelines by signing the Cub Scout Leave No Trace Pledge.
 6. Assist at least three boys in learning Cub Scouting's Leave No Trace Awareness Award

1. Explain the hiking safety rules to your den leader or adult partner. Practice these rules while on a hike.

3. Hike at least 30 minutes with your adult partner, family, or den.
