Featured Beltloops & Pins For February—Heritage

February is a great time for our Scouts to work on their Heritage beltloop and pin and for our Webelos to work on their Family badge at home. Here are the beltloop and pin requirements:

Beltloop - Do all of these:

1. Talk with family members about your family heritage: history, traditions, & culture.
2. Make a poster that shows the origins of your ancestors. Share it with your den or other group.
3. Draw a family tree showing members of your family for 3 or more generations



Pin - Do 5 of these:

1. Participate in a pack heritage celebration in which Cub Scouts give presentations about their family heritage.
2. Attend a family reunion.
3. Correspond with a pen pal from another country. Find out how his or her heritage is different from yours.
4. Learn 20 words in a language other than your native language.
5. Interview a grandparent or other family elder about what it was like when he or she was growing up.
6. Work with a parent or adult partner to organize family photographs in a

photo album.

7. Visit a genealogy library and talk with the librarian about how to trace family records.
Variation: Access a genealogy Web site and learn how to use it to find information about ancestors.
8. Make an article of clothing, a toy, or a tool that your ancestors used. Show it to your den.
9. Help your parent or adult partner prepare one of your family's traditional food dishes.
10. Learn about the origin of your first, middle, or last name.

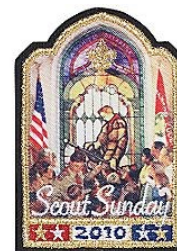

Cubmaster's Minute

One World, One Promise'

Scouting's centennial marks a milestone in the history of the world's largest youth-serving organization.

It all began on a small island. In Dec. of 1907, about 20 British boys from both privileged and working class camped on tiny *Brownsea Island* off the southern coast of England. Led by a famous, retired British general and several other gentlemen, the boys learned about chivalry, honor, woodcraft, nature, lifesaving, and sports. Robert Baden-Powell, the camp's founder, called this experiment Scouting.

Who could have imagined that 100 years later, the program conceived by Baden-Powell to create a more tolerant and peaceful society would have grown into a worldwide movement of 28 million scouts in more than 160 countries? (The United States was the third country to adopt the scouting program in 1910. The scouting program became part of the youth program for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latterday Saints in 1913.)
